ALLERGYNEWS

St. Stephen is a healthy, safe and caring school. Peanuts, nuts, and nut biproducts are considered "unsafe" for school snacks and lunches. We ask that you please read food labels before sending food items to school. The success of our Allergy Safe School Plan is entirely dependent upon the collaborative efforts of all our community members. STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE

Our students continue to do a good job of adhering to our Standardized Dress Code. A reminder that jeans/jeggings are not part of our dress code. Students need to be in dress code clothes (blue and/or white, collared shirt, pants, shorts, dress, skirt or spirit wear) every day except for Civvies Days.



EFFECTIVE USE OF OUR RESOURCES

KISS NRIDE

To ensure the safety of our students we require all parents using the program to follow the procedures outlined below:

- Use the Kiss and Ride lane to drop off or pick up your child.
- Do not use the drive-thru lane for dropping off or picking up children
- Move up the Kiss and Ride lane as far as possible to maximize the number of cars using the program
- Do not get out of your vehicle
- Do not idle your vehicle
- Do not back up your vehicle
- Do not use cell phones nor smoke in the Kiss & Ride

• Students must exit the car using the passenger side doors only The parking lot is for staff parking only between 8 am to 8:30 am and 2:30 pm to 3:15 pm so please park in the neighbourhood. Please follow staff directions when you are asked to move up, drive away, etc... LET'S WORK TOGETHER TO ENSURE STUDENT SAFETY

SAFE ARRIVAL

For the safety of your children, when they are absent from school, please ensure that you call to report student absences. You are reguired to access our Safe Arrival program which allows parents to report their child's absence in advance, or before the bell for the current day. VISITING THE SCHOOL



At St. Stephen, our primary concern is the safety of all the children. School staff must know the identity of all

visitors and the purpose of their visit. For this reason, all visitors, including parents and grandparents are requested to use the buzzer system upon entering the school. Please remember that you are a stranger to other staff and students. Please use the main doors and report to the office upon entering the school. We also ask that when entering, you do not let others in behind you. All visitors must be buzzed in. All parents and visitors are asked to sign in and out of the office when entering the school. Whether you are meeting a teacher, picking up your child or volunteering, you must enter through the front doors of the school and check in at the office.

If you would like to meet with a teacher, you must first report to the office. After checking in at the office, if it is necessary to go to an area of the school other than the office and/or foyer, you will be given a sash or sticker to wear. This will indicate to students and staff that you are a "safe" visitor in the school. Adults walking in the hallway without a sash or sticker will be redirected to the office. Thank you in advance for your co-operation with these important safety procedures.

<u>Rain Days</u>: Students are to wait in the main foyer for teachers on duty, which begins at 8:15 a.m. Parents are encouraged to use the front entrance and not the side doors for safety reasons.

EFFECTIVE USE OF OUR RESOURCES

SCHOOL ACCESS SYSTEM

Upon arrival at the school, you are expected to use the buzzer access system to enter into the building. This remains part of our *Safe Welcome program.* With this system, office staff will be able to see and speak with the visitor and will remotely unlock the front doors once the visitor has been identified. All visitors upon entry are asked to report directly to the office for further assistance. Lunch is a particularly busy time, as well as morning and afternoon recesses for our front office staff. We expect that there may be a brief delay in responding to the door buzzer during those times. Sending lunch to school with your child(ren) in the morning, as opposed to dropping it off during the lunch hour, will help reduce traffic in and out of the school while promoting independence. If children are dropped off at school after the regular school day has begun, you must continue to accompany your child(ren) to the front office of the school to ensure they arrive safely inside and sign in. Your continued cooperation, support and patience is greatly appreciated.

REPORTING TO PARENTS

Progress reports for students in Grades 1 to 8 will be sent home on November 21st. Parent-Teacher conferences for all students from JK to Grade 8 will take place on November 23rd (evening) and 24th (morning). Friday, Nov. 24 is designated P.A. day (professional Activity day), therefore, students will not have school. A letter for scheduling interviews will be sent home shortly for you to complete and return to the classroom teacher by Friday, November 10th. Confirmation of your interview time will be sent home with the progress report. The progress report focuses on general progress in Learning Skills and Work Habits.

EQAO

Please note that results of the provincial EQAO (Education Quality and Accountability Office) test written last spring were made public last month. Since then, teachers have participated in Professional Development which included a review and analysis of the detailed EQAO results and other school assessment data, in order to build on our strengths and address areas requiring improvement. ST. STEPHEN LIBRARY NEWS - LET'S GET READING!

The key to successful learning lies in reading. This is the message students receive when they visit the library. Picture books, primary readers and novels have been carefully organized so that each division can easily find the right text to reflect their interests and abilities. Students are being taught how to find the best books to help develop their creativity and reading comprehension. Here's a checklist your child(ren) can use to help guide them towards achieving their reading goals:

Did you choose a book carefully, so that you will want to read it often once you leave the library? Is the book about something different than the one you took out the last time you visited? Reading books about various topics helps you to learn and write better! Will you remember not to eat or drink while reading your library book, so that it is less likely to be stained or damaged? Will you remember to use a bookmark to hold your place, instead of folding over the page corner? All students are encouraged to set aside some time every evening to immerse themselves in their stories or novels and connect with the setting, plot and characters. A parent resource section has also been set up for use, including topics such as dealing with emotions, bullying prevention and learning strategies. Feel free to drop in and take a look!

Ask your child(ren) about the special authors, computer skills and resource databases they are learning about right now, during their library visits. We will be building on these skills as the year progresses!
