Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11). The visit of the Magi is emphasized on Epiphany Day, and Christ's baptism is celebrated the following Sunday.

TRIBES LEARNING COMMUNITIES ~ TRIBES – INCLUSION

Aside from our basic needs for food, clothing, and shelter, all of us have a basic need and desire to belong. Whether it is in our families, our schools, or our places of work, we experience the need to know that we matter and that we have value to offer to the group in guestion.



When we don't feel that we belong we tend to drop out. Students will generally drop out by gradually moving to "flight or fight". Apathy, boredom, lack of participation, shyness, absenteeism, inability to complete tasks are some of the ways of taking flight. Those that fight, or initiate behaviors (such as hurtful teasing, hitting, stealing, using foul language, etc.), are delivering the same message: "I don't feel included.....nobody cares about me."

The first stage of the Tribes journey to developing a strengthened sense of community is to foster a sense of inclusion for all those involved. Throughout this part of the process, students are offered opportunities so the following can take place. Introduce themselves and offer a short description of feelings, interests, resources, talents or special gualities. Express hopes or expectations for what will happen during the group's time together. Be acknowledged by the group as having being heard, appreciated, and welcomed. Each person entering the group is unique in his/her life experiences. In the words of St. Paul, "we have been given a variety of gifts" (1 Cor. 12:4). It is in the recognition and celebration of those gifts that we welcome each other and help each other to feel a deeper sense of belonging and being part of the group. By doing so, we invite each other to a further stage of the Tribes journey, Influence, which we will be the focus of next month's newsletter.

ECO TEAM FEBRUARY 1st IS SWEATER DAY!

National Sweater Day is Friday, February 2nd, 2018. As this falls on a PA Day, we will be having our Sweater Day on Thursday February, 1st, 2018. All student are encouraged to come to school dressed in dress code however they can wear any warm civies sweater of their choice. The heat will be turned down as a means to conserve energy for one day.

INDOOR SHOES

All students need indoor shoes at school. This keeps classroom floors dry and safe, and ensures that in the event of an emergency, students will be prepared and wearing shoes.

EFFECTIVE USE OF RESOURCES

WINTER CLOTHING AND RECESS

Our Canadian winter weather continues! Please ensure that your child comes to school prepared to participate in all activities, including outdoor recess. All children



should have hats, neck warmers, gloves, warm coats and boots. Long scarves should be avoided as they pose a safety risk. Younger students who tend to be a little more interactive with the snow, should bring snow pants and extra clothing and socks to school in case a change of clothing is necessary.

COLD WINTER WEATHER

We obtain weather information throughout the day from the Environment Canada Weather Info. Line, and on extremely cold days (-15 to -18 below), we either keep the students indoors and/ or limit the amount of time that students spend outside.

In colder weather, we receive many requests to allow children to remain indoors when they have a cold, flu, etc. If your child is not well, it would be best for your child to remain at home. Thank you for your support in keeping others healthy.

KISS NRIDE - PARKINGLOT SAFETY

A reminder to **please** continue to follow the procedures outlined below to ensure the safety of ALL our children:

- Use the **Kiss and Ride lane** to drop off or pick up your child.
- Do not use the **drive-thru lane** for dropping off or picking up children.
- Move up the Kiss and Ride lane as far as possible to maximize the number of cars using the program.
- Do NOT get out of your vehicle, rather encourage your child to make their way on their own to their yard or class by having packing on or near.
- Do NOT back up. Students must exit the car using the **pas**senger side doors only.
- Do NOT **park/stop** in the front of the school (including the north east side of that area). It is designated as a fire/tow away zone and for bus/taxi access only.
- Please do NOT park your vehicle by the driveway entrance gate, as this blocks the sidewalk and impedes a flow of traffic in and out of our drop-off/pick-up loop.

YCDSB INCLEMENT WEATHER NOTIFICATION

School transportation service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather and/or poor road conditions. Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open when transportation services are cancelled.

The safety and well-being of our students is taken into consideration when making decisions concerning transportation service cancellation. Information regarding the cancellation of school transportation or school closures will be made available by 6:15 a.m. Please see attached fluer for more information.

SCHOOL ACCESS SYSTEM

As a reminder, in the interest of safety for all students and staff, we require all parents and guests to the school to access the building through the use of the front doors of the school. All visitors are required to buzz in through the front office and report to the office. Despite the best intentions of many to courteously open the door for those outside waiting to enter, we ask that those who have gained access to the building do not open the door for anyone unless unlocked by the Buzzer Access System. It is an important part of the entry process to allow the office staff to identify the visitors before allowing them access to the building.

As well, we ask that any parent/guardian who is dropping off a lunch, please do so in the bins provided in the foyer vestibule and that they do not linger in the foyer during the lunch hour. Should you wish to see your child or pick up for lunch please proceed to the office and sign in/out. You may want to consider sending a lunch with your child(ren) as these are important life skills for children to learn responsibility and organization in helping to prepare/pack their own lunch. Your continued cooperation is greatly appreciated.

CLASSROOMDOORS

Classroom doors are locked at the end of the day for safety reasons. Custodians will NOT be responsible for unlocking doors to retrieve forgotten items. Please help us encourage students taking responsibility for their learning by bringing all needed items including agendas, home at the end of the day and bringing what is needed for learning to school each day.

COLD AND FLUSEASON

With the cold and flu season well under way please review the notice sent out by York Region Public Health. Please encourage students to wash their hands and cover their mouths when coughing or sneezing. Students who are ill should stay home as advised by their physician. Flu Season is on its way – are you ready?



Flu season is nearly here. Be prepared by getting the flu shot as early as possible.

The first and best step to preventing influenza (the flu), is to get the flu shot every year. Influenza spreads quickly and easily from an infected person to others.

Everyone six months of age and older can get the flu shot.

Flu shots are available at:

- · Health care provider's offices for people six months of age and older
- · Participating pharmacies, for people five years of age and older

Visit ontario.ca/flu to find where you can get the flu shot.

How can the flu be avoided?

- Get the flu shot!
- <u>Wash your hands</u> well and often with soap and warm water. If soap and water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based <u>hand sanitizer</u>
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and throw the tissue out immediately. Wash your hands afterward. Cough into your upper sleeve if you don't have a tissue.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- · Avoid large crowds and stay home when you are sick
- Keep common surfaces and items clean and disinfected

To register your child(ren) for September 2018, you must provide the following original documents/forms for each child:

- Roman Catholic Baptismal Certificate (child or parent)

- Proof of Age (i.e. child's birth certificate)

- Proof of Legal Status in Canada (if required)

- Proof of Residency (2 documents required: 1 of Property Tax Bill, Proof of Purchase, Lease/Rental Agreement and 1 of Driver's License, utility bill, etc.)

 Proof of English Separate School Support (i.e. property tax bill that shows school support designation, MPAC Assessment Notice, confirmation of school support designation or, completed and signed school support form(s), which are included in the registration package). We wish to remind families that every time they move to a new residence, School Support form(s) must be completed.

Please exercise discretion in deciding whether to send your child to school when school transportation has been cancelled.

Please note the following:

- A decision to cancel school transportation service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make alternate arrangements to transport their children • to and from school if school bus service is cancelled.
- If transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will not operate in the afternoon. •
- In the event school transportation is cancelled, exams, tests, quizzes, excursions, charter trips, school programs, co-curricular activities, evening presentations, workshops, as well as, parent meetings (i.e. Identification, Placement, and Review Committee Meetings, IPRCs) will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Secondary School Cafeteria Services will be cancelled
- All evening permits will be cancelled
- All Continuing Education evening classes will be cancelled •
